Go On a Job Interview

Important tips for your interview:

1. Your interviewer may have some challenging questions for you such as;

"What sets you apart from the other applicants?"

To answer this question, take into consideration what it is that the employer needs and what it is that you can provide. Consider the key elements of the job and how you can add value to the organization. (hard working, dedicated, honest, reliable, etc.)

"Tell us about yourself."

Your answer should be no more than one minute long and include a description of where you have worked recently as well as what you would like to do next. Why are you interested in this company?

Remember the three Rs!!!

Research... the job, the organization, the market, the industry

Rehearse... have good responses ready.

Relax... enjoy the experience because you are prepared!

2. Don't forget what to wear!

The following ideas can never be neglected:

- Look clean and neat. Make sure that your hair is done appropriately. Women - do not wear wild hairdo's. Men - get a trim of head and facial hair.
- Do not wear a perfume or cologne as many people are allergic. Bathing with a good quality bath soap will leave a light scent. You will be nervous and a gentle scent can mask the perspiring you may be doing. An unscented antiperspirant can be used.
- Cover any tattoos and avoid gaudy jewelry. Definitely limit pierced jewelry to ears only. Do not wear nose or tongue jewelry

MEN

- Wear a suit or sport jacket with color coordinated trousers
- The color should be neutral or dark - blue, black or gray is best
- Wear a tie - even if you will never wear one after you get the job
- Shoes should be leather - clean and polished - black is best
- Make sure your nails are trimmed and that they are clean.

WOMEN

- Wear a classic suit or a simple dress with a jacket. This is not a time to be provocative or sexy. Some appropriate colors are navy blue, black, dark green, dark red, burgundy, or gray.
- Dress in a higher style that the position calls for but do not attempt to out dress everyone there.
- Avoid wearing clothes that are tight, revealing or trendy. It may be the very latest fashion but it will not impress the interviewer
- Fingernails should be trimmed to a length that doesn't leave an observer wondering how you keep from stabbing yourself. The polish should be closer to a color your mom might wear than to a color that your kid sister would go for.

3. Make sure you have a reliable ride!

Do you have a car? Does a friend or family member drive? Do you need to take the bus?

Check out www.octa.net for bus routes to your interview. If you are using a car, check out www.mapquest.com for directions from your location to the interview. You can come into the Orangewood Resource Center to learn how to get a bus pass. ILP eligible youth may qualify for a free monthly bus pass. If you qualify, call SSA at (714) 704-8894 and slowly record your name, address, phone number, social security number and your date of birth. Make sure to practice before the actual day, just in case you get lost.
